## WASTE OILS

recycling location into storage for processing indicates excellent opportunities for Blackmer pumps.

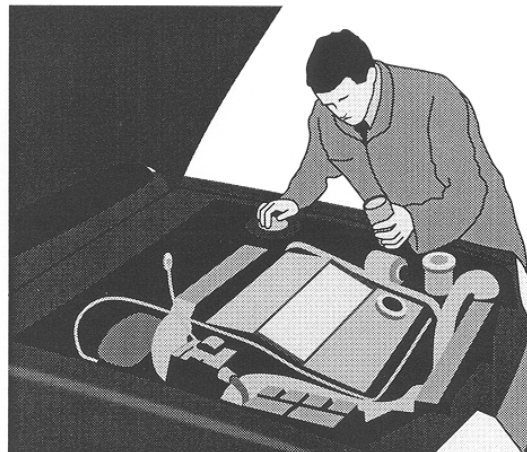
This recycled oil is often resold as low cost lubricants for use in such applications as industry and mining.

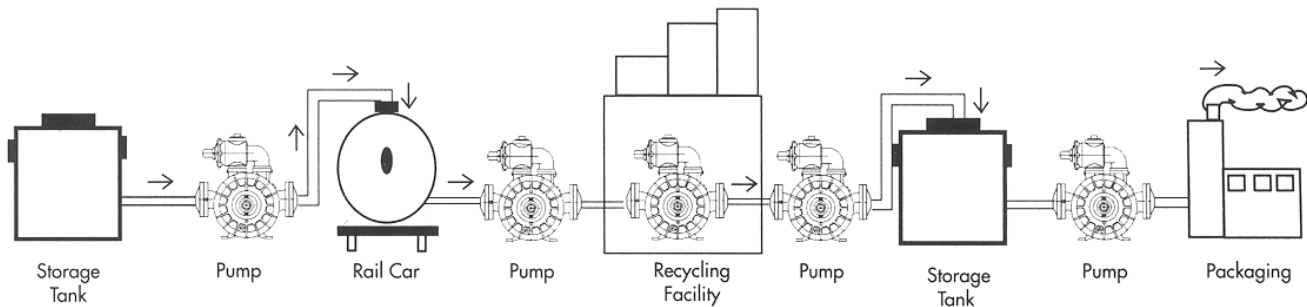


# CHECKLIST

4. Available site utilities

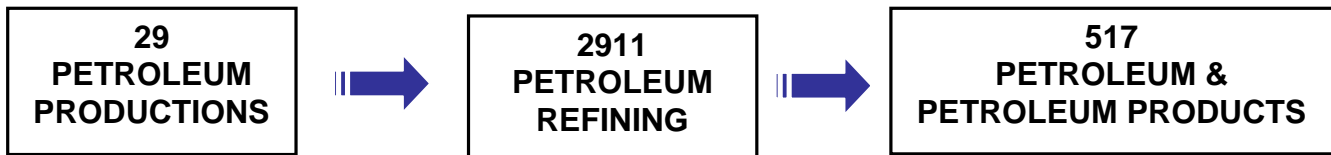
